Learning to Love Your Body— Stoma and All *From Coloplast*

Following your ostomy surgery, you will no doubt have an adjustment period of figuring out your new routines and schedule. You will be learning about your appliance, how to use it, when to change it, and how it works. Although there may be frustrating and discouraging days, as you get the hang of your body and the newness of it all, you may also find yourself fascinated with your body's adaptability. Some of the most resilient, inventive and strong people are ostomates who are changing the way people think by helping to reduce shame around ostomies as well as creating networks and communities to encourage and support others in similar situations.

Body Love

We live in a world where we are bombarded on a daily basis by media showing us advertisements of what beauty should be. The unreachable goals are already set, and then you throw in an ostomy? How in the world are we supposed to love our bodies when we feel so different? Building confidence begins with you. It begins with self-love and embracing your uniqueness. This can take time, and giving yourself the time to heal (both literally and figuratively) and come to terms with the changes and the new daily rhythms will go a long way in boosting your confidence. The great thing about confidence is that it is contagious. Others can feel it in the way you talk, walk, and are proud about yourself and your body, and when they sense it, it transforms the way they see you. This doesn't mean that self-love is easy and immediate, but it does mean that it is a possible and attainable goal. One of the ways to lead yourself into recovery and learning to love your body is to get active. Maybe you love to run, swim, or hike in the mountains, or you've always wanted to join a gym but your disease was holding you back from the commitment of it. Have you always

wanted to learn an instrument, or join a band? There are amazing people out there with stories of how they overcame their fears, and also how they discovered the right product for their unique lifestyle and activity.

Every body is different and being patient with yourself and your healing process is vital, especially within the first few months. While inspirational stories about others can help to normalize your situation, it is also completely normal to feel discouraged and down at times. If you are feeling extreme discouragement or hopelessness, don't hesitate to reach out to a licensed therapist or a healthcare professional. It is important to be able to share as honestly as possible about your situation so that you can begin to move forward.

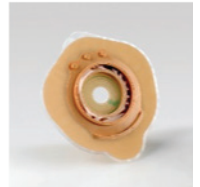

- 5 foot long kink and crack resistant tubing
- "cuttable" every 12 inches to preference
- soft outlet designed to be leak resistant
- 2 eyelet holes at top of bag for hanging

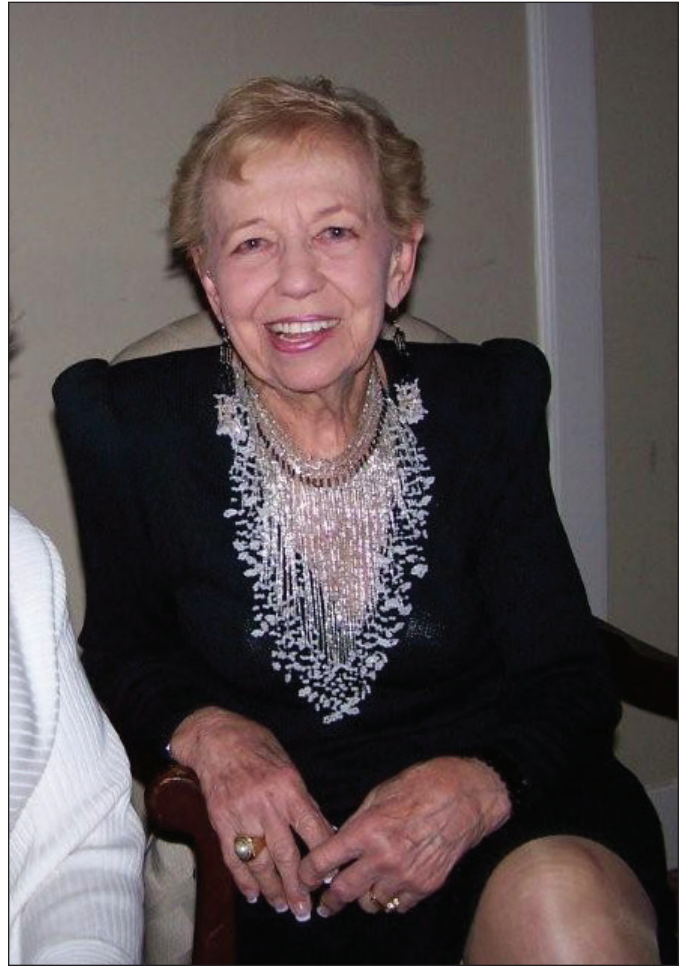

In Memoriam - Dorothy Andrews

The Ostomy Association of the Houston Area is incredibly sad to announce that we have lost a beloved member. Dorothy Andrews, age 93, passed away on April 12. Dorothy had her colostomy due to cancer in 1973 when she was 43 years old. She made a personal vow to God that "if I came through this surgery, I would spend the rest of my life helping other people who had this type of surgery." She did just that in every city she lived in thereafter—Chicago, Dallas, and Houston. Dorothy was the face of our Visitor Training Program for many, many years. She herself visited more people than we can count, and she also arranged for others to act as visitors, including personal visits to all the area hospitals and often phone visits (frequently on weekends and holidays). For many years, Dorothy spoke to the WOCN/ET training program at MD Anderson until it was discontinued. She was simply tireless, and she made a huge difference in the lives of many ostomates. Dorothy was an inspiration in demonstrating how active ostomates could be, playing tennis and golf and exercising frequently. When our group would participate in the CCFA Take Steps walk, the rest of us (much younger I'll note) struggled to keep up with her! She and her late husband, Tom Andrews, hosted our annual holiday party at the Pine Forest Country Club until his death in 2015. We all loved Dorothy very much and her loss leaves a big hole in our hearts. *Dorothy's son, Glenn Andrews, has graciously asked that remembrances in honor of Dorothy be made to the Ostomy Association of the Houston Area at P.O. Box 25164, Houston, Texas 77265-5164.*

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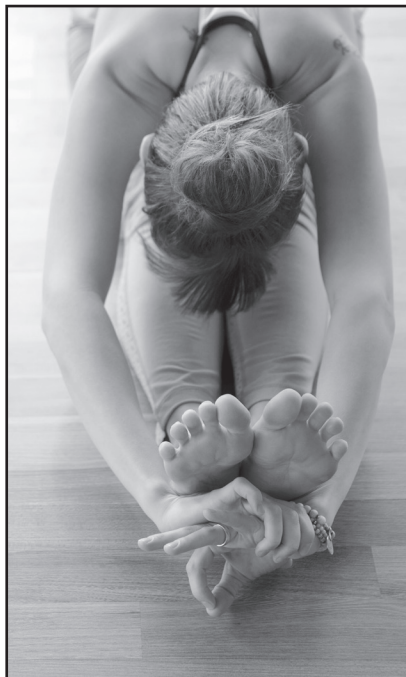

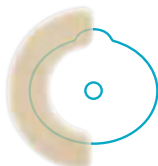

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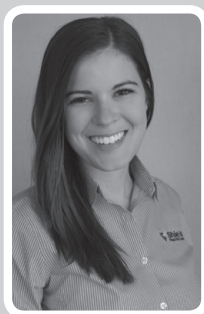
