

What an Ostomate Should Know About Medication

- Liquid is faster acting than pills.
- The degree of compression of a tablet determines the rate the medicine is dissolved in one's system.
- The amount of medication absorbed by the body depends on the amount of intestine available. Therefore, the type of drugs to be taken must be based on the "absorption power" you have.
- Time-release capsules are not for the ileostomate. They do not have enough time to dissolve in the short remaining intestine and are passed virtually intact.
- Time-release medicine will completely dissolve at once if alcohol is consumed with it or shortly thereafter. An overdose could result!
- Most medication is available in a variety of forms—be sure to tell your pharmacist that you have an ostomy so that he/she can provide the right form for the prescribed medication.

Baytown Ostomy Support Group met August 12th and discussed the topic of Resilience.

"That indescribable quality that allows some people to be knocked down by life and come back stronger than ever"—this is the dynamic process of positive adaptation of Resilience! High resilience levels equate to health-promoting behaviors.

Using handouts, the group divided into small groups and worked through an assessment of their own Resilience Factors. They were able to identify the factors they felt were present in their life versus those they felt would be of benefit to develop from the list below:

Resilience Factors

The small group discussion was unexpectedly beneficial as individuals with a large number of resilience factors happened to be grouped with individuals who seemed to need support identifying their resilience factors. Overall, we enjoyed the opportunity to discuss this important topic, "Has resilience played a role in your adaptation to life with an ostomy?"

Sugar Land Group News

The Houston Methodist Sugar Land Ostomy Support group met August 15th.

Araz Sarkassian, RD, LD, presented information on diet and nutrition with a stoma and included handouts from the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics. Key points included:

- Start slow with your diet following your surgery—avoid high fiber and greasy foods.
- Remember that some foods are known for causing gas and bloating—such as onions, cabbage, cauliflower, and broccoli to name a few.
- Keep a food dairy, write down what you eat so that if something changes or causes distress you can eliminate that item
- Some foods may discolor your stool, look back at your food diary to see what the culprit may be.
- General vitamins supplements are usually fine, but check with your doctor prior to starting dietary supplements of vitamins, minerals, and formulas. Use chewable vitamins whenever possible to increase absorption.
- Remember, everyone is different, it really is a matter of trial and error to determine what works best with your stoma.
- Call for help when you need it, have contacts or refer to you doctor or ostomy nurse when you are having issues or concerns.
- If you have an ileostomy, be sure to measure your stool and replace with at least the same amount of oral fluid intake throughout the day.
- Alert your doctor if you notice undigested pills or whole foods in your ostomy bag.
- And, remember, a food diary can help you identify the cause for various issues, such as constipation, gas, bloating, odor, discolored stool, loose stool or diarrhea, and discomfort.

Many questions were asked and answered as well as personal tips from the attendees!

We welcomed new attendees: Terri, Gene, Carolina, Bert, Caranita, and Carey. Thank you to Gene for bringing excess supplies for ostomy care that he donated for persons in need.
