WHEN SHOULD YOU CALL THE DOCTOR?

When you have:

- Cramps lasting more than 2 or 3 hours.
- A deep cut in the stoma.
- Excessive bleeding from the stoma opening (or a moderate amount in the pouch in several emptyings).
- Bleeding at the junction between the stoma and skin.
- Severe skin irritations or deep ulcers.
- Unusual change in stoma size and appearance. Change to purple or blue color may be an indication of trouble.
- Severe watery discharge lasting more than 5 or 6 hours.
- Severe odor lasting more than a week.
- Any other unusual occurrences regarding the ostomy.

5 Ways to Reduce your Cancer Risk:

- 1. Eat a healthy, low cal diet.
- 2. Don't smoke.
- 3. Cut your exposure to sunlight.
- 4. Exercise.
- 5. Reduce contact with environmental toxins such as herbicides and insecticides.

We encourage you to bring your spouse or significant other and members of your immediate family to our meetings.
