This training is conducted every other February. This training is a requirement for certification of new visitors and provides renewal certification for visitors who have previously

been trained. Great effort goes into planning this event and we hope that you will consider supporting it with your attendance. Through an effort in communicating with home health care workers in the Houston area, we anticipate an increase in requests for visitors. Try plain, nonfat yogurt as a healthy alternative to mayonnaise and sour cream in dips, salad dressings, and other recipes. You'll get healthy bacteria, less fat

(0 grams per eight-ounce serving instead of 75 for mayo and 47 for sour cream), and fewer calories. A whole cup of plain, nonfat yogurt has the same number of calories—100—as only one tablespoon of mayo!
