#### **Central Group News**

We had a new record number of 38 people attending and having fun at our annual Ostomy Association of the Houston Area Holiday Party including members and guests from our Satellite Groups as well as the Central Group. We also would like to thank Ron Cerreta for donating exercise equipment for door prizes and Ed Wood for providing the poinsettias which were also used for door prizes.

Looking back on the past year, here is a brief synopsis of some of the things we did:

We had a Visitor's Training Session on Saturday, February 7th, during which we had 17 members learn or renew the proper techniques for visiting patients and those who are considering ostomy surgery. Visitation can occur in the hospital, by telephone, at home, or else where. We learned the way it should be done and also what to avoid doing by demonstration and role play.

We celebrated our 53rd Anniversary of being an Ostomy Association with a reception at the ACS Building in March.

This spring we had a very enthusiastic Patti Suler volunteer to be the new editor of our Newsletter and she is doing a great job thus far.

In April, we had Robert F. Gagel, MD, explain Glucocorticoid-Induced Osteoporosis and the various causes and treatments for it.

In May several of us from the Central & Satellite Groups participated in the Take Steps for Crohn's and Colitis Walk



sponsored by the CCFA.

In June, we officially elected two new directors to the OAHA Board and re-elected two current Directors; each result line below starts with the year their term expires:

#### **Positive Trends**

We have developed a rather extensive networking system, designed to let people know who we are, what we're all about, and how to contact us. This system comprises the following entities:

- A monthly newsletter.
- A web page with contact information.
- Meeting announcements in all of our county newspapers.
- Posters and brochures distributed to doctors' offices, clinics, hospitals.
- Information packs placed in nurses' stations throughout our local hospital.

Having established this broad network, we are sometimes disappointed to learn that there are people in our local area or

associated with our local hospital, who are still unaware of our existence and our activities. Despite this, we are pleased to report that we are in fact, reaching an increasing number of ostomates and preostomates. We are hearing from ostomates who have been informed about us in any



number of ways, including having been told about us or given a copy of our newsletter by a friend or another ostomate.

The new ostomates we are seeing appear more self-assured, are very open to discussion about their ostomy, and are eager to learn all they can about it. In general they are more committed and better prepared to enter the ostomy world. There is little question in our minds that the new ostomates are receiving greater exposure to life as an ostomate both before and after surgery. The source of this exposure begins with our "Angels" (WOCNs) and includes newsletters, distributed literature, the internet, and the old reliable "word-of-mouth".

While it would be naïve of us to assume that these ostomates did not experience the fears, anxieties, uncertainties and depression suffered by most new ostomates over the past six or seven decades, it is our distinct impression that the increased exposure to and better understanding of the entire ostomy process keeps those experiences to a more manageable level for our "newbies".

We are excited to be witnessing this very positive trend in getting new ostomates acclimated to life as an ostomate and back to normal living. It seems like it has taken a long time to see such progress; but, it has been worth every bit of time and effort we have expended. Having said that, it should be understood that we have no intention of stopping here; we'll just keep trying to make things even better!






