The Teddy Bear with an Ostomy is One Year Old A story of how a bear inspires hope & healing

Last October, I approached our support group members and board members about starting a Big Bear Project. I passed around a Teddy bear designed with his own little stoma and removable ostomy pouch. I named him Awesome Ollie the Teddy Bear with an Ostomy. The idea was to give these bears to children who've undergone ostomy surgery at Radys Children's Hospital. I asked our group to sponsor bears in our area. The answer was an enthusiastic, yes!

As I tell you what's happened over the last 365 days, keep in mind, this project all started with YOU!

Our members along with Shield Healthcare have sponsored over 100 bears for children with ostomies in San Diego. Word quickly spread and people from all across the United States contacted me to send bears to children in their home state.

Bears have been sponsored in California, Washington, Arizona, Colorado, Texas, Nebraska, Kansas, Arkansas, Missouri, Wisconsin, Indiana, Tennessee, Mississippi, Louisiana, Alabama,

Baytown Ostomy Support Group met December 11. We welcomed Kim Thorn and Robert (Bobby) Martinez from McKesson Patient Care Solutions. Kim and Bobby shared with us how McKesson has become a company from "doctor to doorstep" with online support, customer service, and convenient shipping. A handout titled "Medicare Utilization Guidelines for ostomy products" was distributed. Bobby notes "If Medicare covers it, other insurance plans usually cover it" as the rule of thumb on ostomy products.

Kim and Bobby explained to the group how McKesson works as "feet on the street" to meet the ostomates' needs. The company will ship first time without a script but must have a signed script for second shipment. In addition, every 12 months a physician signature is needed for ostomy supplies. They are working with some organizations on "e-signature" which is an electronic platform to facilitate this process.

For those ostomates who have Humana benefits, there are changes expected in 2018. McKesson will be working diligently to support their customers through these changes.

Plan Ahead for an Unexpected Change in Your Ostomy Routine

Recently I had an accident that put my right hand out of commission for 12 days. While sitting in the emergency room, I thought not about my injury, but how am I going to change my ostomy wafer and bag left handed? My right hand was not only unable to be used, but unable to get wet. The way it was bandaged and with a splint, all sorts of images flashed through my brain.

It was very interesting and difficult when I started my new left-handed routine for my colostomy. I wish that I had pre-cut a box of wafers as I cut them myself as my stoma is oval. Wow, would that have helped! My husband said he would help me and cut the wafer but I could not even mark it with my right hand and anyway, I just "cut the wafer" by doing it for over 13 years. Struggling and frustrated I did manage to cut the wafer with the last three digits of my right hand...not the best, however, it was functional.

Taking the wafer off with one hand and not pulling the skin was a challenge, but finally I just dripped the remover on the edge of the wafer and worked the wafer off. Carefully I placed the new wafer on. I started celebrating—oops, too soon.

I use a two-piece system and trying to attach the bag to the wafer was interesting. I must have checked all around the seal numerous times and usually found an area that had not been attached properly.



Finally on, and my change complete, I was thrilled to get that over with. I now keep my wafers cut in advance and still try completing my routine left-handed once a week just in case. Things were going great until the strong antibiotics kicked in and then came diarrhea—an ostomate knows about that cleanup!!



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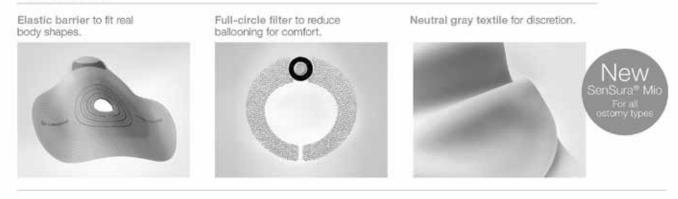
