Can You Still Drink Alcohol?

via Chicago (IL) The New Outlook; Green Bay (WI) Ostomy Support Group; and North Central OK Ostomy Outlook

Yes! And you may find that gastrointestinal upsets associated with alcohol that used to occur before surgery are gone now with the removal of the diseased bowel. A word of caution, however: those with ileostomies are at greater risk of dehydration when drinking alcohol. Have water on the side, or extra juice along with your

Upon request from a doctor, nurse, or social worker, a specially trained visitor will be asked to contact an ostomy patient by phone or visit them in person before and/or after surgery. The visitor will be matched as nearly as possible according to sex, age, and type of ostomy. The visitor does not give medical advice, and there is no charge for this service. The Central Group welcomed Tabatha Schroeder with Coloplast to our March meeting. Tabatha covered the following topics in her presentation:

- Houston will be the site for the WOCN conference on September 29-30, 2017. We are invited to participate, so mark your calendars.
- Tabatha asked us to tell our surgeons about the Coloplast Pre-Surgery kit with video, sample pouches and other information to prepare patients for surgery. She is trying to get them to all the nurses she knows who work with patients before surgery.
- Coloplast has a post-surgery program with a kit to go home with the patient and the program includes follow-up calls from nurses and a contact number for questions.
- She demonstrated the Mio wafers and pouches. The wafers are now available in convex. She had samples of their alcohol-free paste. A couple of members had issues and those were discussed.

Carol Bayens also was gracious enough to visit with us about how her husband Chuck used Coloplast wafers not only for his ostomy but also for the fistulas that he developed. Carol and the nurses she worked with were quite creative in crafting the wafers to protect the skin and capture the leakages. As many of you know, Chuck was once a member of the Board of our group. We were lucky to have him as a member, and Chuck was very lucky to have Carol as such a wonderful caretaker during his life. We can't thank Carol enough for sharing her experience with us. This type of invaluable input from our members is what makes this group so important.

Baytown Group News

Baytown Support Group met on March 7 with "RJ" Poonawala from Spring Branch Medical Supply as our guest speaker. RJ and his family are passionate about the services they are able to provide through their durable home medical equipment and supply company. Spring Branch Medical Supply has been in business since 1985. In addition to ostomy care products, they are able to help with CPAP machines and masks, orthotics, mobility equipment such as walkers and wheelchairs, diabetic supplies, hospital beds, incontinence care products and skin health lotions and cleansers! RJ came to talk with group about Medicare's expansion of the competitive bidding program. From the CMS.gov website, I pulled this basic information: (https://www.cms.gov/Medicare/Medicare-Fee-for-Service-Payment/DMEPOSCompetitiveBid)

Durable Medical Equipment, Prosthetics, Orthotics and Supplies (DMEPOS) Competitive Bidding Program was mandated by Congress through the Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement, and Modernization Act of 2003. The statute requires that Medicare replace the current fee schedule payment methodology for selected Durable Medical Equipment, Prosthetics, Orthotics and Supplies items with a competitive bid process. The intent is to improve the effectiveness of the Medicare methodology for setting DMEPOS payment amounts, which will reduce beneficiary outof-pocket expenses and save the Medicare program money while ensuring beneficiary access to quality items and services.

RJ is active in the DME community, and as an advocate for ostomates and others who currently have options for medical supply coverage, there is concern for the impact of competitive bidding. This will affect not only Medicare but the privatelyinsured as well. Durable medical suppliers believe that competitive bidding is in the President's budget now and could be signed before the election, but there is uncertainty as to whether it would pass congress. Appealing to your representative in congress is a strategy that may help save your medical supply coverage in the future! Make the connection-let them know that you want to keep your options for ostomy care products! An organization that is working towards this goal is "People for Quality Care." They have a website and a 1-800#. drink. Unless a fair amount of the large colon was removed, colostomates are in little danger of dehydration when drinking liquor. Urostomates need not fear dehydration, but you will be making more trips to the bathroom to empty your appliance. Beer and carbonated drinks can produce gas. Some medications are less effective if taken with alcohol—be sure to follow instructions. Alcohol may give you loose output or extra output, or it may have no effect on waste at all. In some people, with or without an ostomy, this makes the bowels more watery and a few may find that some restriction is necessary, though it is always worth experimenting. Everybody's different. One woman reported in January that, at Christmas, she found that her ileostomy would stand up to port, sherry, gin and cider, but (regretfully) she said, "It wouldn't take beer." A year later, she reported: "It's all right now – it can take beer as well!"

Abdominal Noises

UOAA Update 2014

Abdominal noises happen! However, as ostomates, we are embarrassed and wonder if something is wrong. It is usually "sound and fury, signifying nothing" important. Any of the following may be the cause:

You are hungry. Peristalsis goes on whether there is anything to move through or not. *Empty guts growl. Eat a snack between meals. Or consider four small meals a day.*

You are nervous, so peristalsis is increased. Try to slow down. Try to eliminate some stress (especially at meals times).

Coffee and tea, cola and beer—all stimulate peristalsis. Beverages consumed on an empty stomach will produce gurgles as peristalsis redoubles its movements. Add a little bit of food with your beverages. Try some crackers and/or bread.

Eating a high-fiber diet produces gas, so rumbles increase. Mix with other foods. Reduce amount of insoluble fiber. Switch to more soluble fiber. Intestines do not digest starches and sugars as easily as proteins and fats. Reduce the amount of carbohydrates that cause you trouble. Mix with proteins and fats.




