Ruth Bryant (2010) found that adaptation following ostomy surgery included all of these factors: Resume self-care, Return to work, Return to routine activities of daily living, Ability to recognize problems and seek help, Satisfaction with quality of life and Satisfaction with sexual relationship. United Ostomy Association of America (UOAA) is the GPS (that is the new road map) to help those living with an ostomy with adaptation following surgery.

The formal mission of the UOAA reads like this: The UOAA is committed to improving QOL (quality of life) for persons who have had or will have intestinal or urinary diversion.

Affiliated support groups like the Baytown, Central and Northwest group are people helping people. These groups interact to share experiences and resolve ostomy related problems.

With our patient visiting programs, educational presentations, and communications like the United Ostomy Association of Houston website http://www.uoghouston.org and the newsletter—this mission is addressed.

#### WHAT IS YOUTH RALLY?

The Youth Rally is a 5-night camp that provides a fun, therapeutic environment for kids between the ages of 11 and 17 living with any sort of affliction to the bowel and/or bladder systems.

The Youth Rally is designed to help campers understand that they are not alone and that everyone has the same opportunities to set and achieve personal goals regardless of medical or physical challenges. Youth Rally participants benefit from educational programs, peer support, friendship, and all of the fun activities designed to promote confident, independent living.



For many campers, and counselors, Youth Rally is the first time they've met someone with their same medical condition(s) which can play an important role in their own personal growth.

During the week campers are able to enjoy a wide variety of activities including arts & crafts, athletics, outings to local cultural centers, educational rap sessions and the infamous Youth Rally talent show. As an added bonus, camp is hosted at a fully accessible college camps, which provides an opportunity for youth to understand that they **CAN** manage their condition, even outside the comforts of home.

#### WHY YOUTH RALLY?

For over 30 years the Youth Rally has been a one of a kind adventure! In a setting amongst their peers, surrounded by adult mentors, Youth Rally campers gain confidence, independence, and often a fresh outlook on their medical and physical conditions.

#### WHAT MAKES YOUTH RALLY SO UNIQUE?

The Youth Rally is "staffed" by volunteer counselors living with the same types of conditions as the youth participants. Many of the Youth Rally counselors were once campers! Onsite volunteers also include specialty trained nurses and additional licensed medical professionals who volunteer their time to ensure the safety of all.

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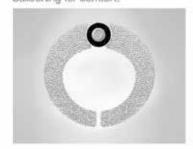
