# Congress is Back in Action! We Need Your Help TODAY!


The leadership of the House of Representatives is continuing to work with conservative and moderate Republicans to repeal and replace the Affordable Care Act (ACA). Their proposal, the American Health Care Act (AHCA), was pulled from consideration a few weeks ago when it could not muster the votes to pass. However, House leaders continue to try and find common ground to modify the House leadership bill to make it passable.

The emerging House leadership plan includes several provisions that would be devastating for patients with chronic, complex, and costly medical conditions. The latest bill would remove protections for individuals with pre-existing health conditions and eliminate the ACA's Essential Health Benefits-federal quality standards for health insurance policies. In place of these protections, the bill would expand health savings accounts and tax credits, and establish state risk sharing subsidies, and leave it to states to determine which essential health benefits they will offerlikely leading to lower quality benefits for patients with costly diseases.

Patients with costly health conditions could never put enough money in a health savings account, nor take advantage of a tax break associated with not utilizing healthcare services. Segregating

high-cost patients into high-risk programs has not worked in the past, even with a federal subsidy. Additionally, eliminating the federal mandate that insurers offer a minimum level of benefits would likely mean that many states could offer substandard benefits for those with pre-existing health conditions or hike premiums for the most vulnerable Americans in desperate need of essential healthcare.



The House of Representatives could vote on this bill when it returns on April 24th from the Easter recess.

Let's unite nationwide to protect patients and oppose discriminatory and dangerous provisions! If you care about the future of healthcare, help us advocate here.

Our first presenter was Yolanda Lopez, the Volunteer and Client Services Coordinator with CanCare, an organization who closely works with cancer patients. Like the OAHA, CanCare finds volunteers who are cancer survivors or family members of cancer survivors. CanCare tries to closely match the volunteers with cancer patients according to cancer type, treatment method, age, gender and family situation. We look forward to working with CanCare to help those who are ostomates because of cancer.

We also welcomed Sheila Wadenpfuhl, RD, LD, a registered dietitian with Shield Healthcare. Sheila presided over a lively discussion in which many attendees shared experiences and tips about different types of food, supplements and vitamins that affect ostomates with ileostomies, colostomies and urostomies. We all found the discussion very helpful and we very much appreciate Shield's ongoing support of our organization.

Our next meeting is Monday, May 15. Our presenter will be LaToya Cooper with Patient Caregivers, Inc. Patient Caregivers is an agency who provides experienced caregivers for those who need assistance either at home, in the hospital or in a nursing home. The company was founded by a doctor who, after being disappointed with the quality of caregivers he could find for his parents, decided to create an agency which would recruit caregivers who would provide the exceptional service his parents deserved. I have personal experience with Patient Caregivers, as they have provided the caregivers for my mother for the last 3 years. It should be an important and helpful presentation.

The OAHA plans to have a table at the CCFA Take Steps walk at the Houston Zoo on May 20. We hope you can attend the walk. If not, we hope you can donate. Look for more information in this newsletter.

### **Baytown Group News**

Baytown Ostomy Support Group welcomed Tabatha Schroeder, RN from Coloplast to the April Support Group. Tabatha's presentation, "Updates in the Brava World" was informative and insightful. The group had the opportunity to consider the rationale for use of barrier seals and consider product updates.

Tabatha explained to the group that Coloplast had utilized a new polymer formulation to update the Brava® Protective Seal. The company did something unexpected when introducing this new product—they left the former Moldable Ring and provided the new moldable Brava® Protective Seal as options for their consumers. Those consumers who are satisfied with the Moldable Ring will not lose the option to use it.

Key benefits of the Protective Seal include: protection against leakage, protection of the skin, and ease of handling. New formulation of polymer makes the seal flexible but strong at the same time. It is able to stay in place until removed. The seal follows body movements, providing a feeling of security and accommodating an active lifestyle! # Plan Now to Attend the 6th UOAA National Conference!—August 22-26, 2017— Irvine, California


#### **Conference-Related Information**

All walkers will have the opportunity to enjoy games, activities, and refreshments at a celebration at the end of the walk course. 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
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
