Update on the Repeal and Replace Efforts of the Affordable Care Act

Since our last newsletter, there has been movement in Congress on healthcare reform. On Thursday, May 4th, the House of Representatives passed the American Health Care Act (AHCA), the House Leadership bill to repeal and replace the Affordable Care Act (ACA). Many of the 11th-hour changes further weakened protections for patients with chronic and costly medical conditions to secure enough votes for passage from House Republicans.


The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) has yet to officially "score" the measure so the exact cost (or savings) to the healthcare system as well as the number of people covered (or losing coverage) will remain unclear until CBO finishes its review. Key provisions from H.R. 1628 include:

- Repeals the individual mandate
- Modifies ACA premium tax credits
- Reduces cost-sharing subsidies for low-income individuals
- Continues to require dependent coverage on family plans until 26
- Includes continuous coverage requirements
- Allows states to opt out of Essential Health Benefit and Community Rating requirements

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- Adds funding for high-risk pools for some individuals with pre-existing conditions who experience higher premiums
- Allows states to implement work requirements for non-disabled Medicaid beneficiaries





Senate Action on Health Reform

Many Senators have registered concern for the approach taken by H.R. 1628 with at least a dozen Republican Senators indicating that they could not vote for the House-passed legislation without significant changes.

Rather than take up the House-passed bill, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) established a working group of Senate Republicans with the stated goal of crafting a healthcare bill that could secure at least 50 Republican votes (the Republicans hold 52 Senate seats).

The Senate does not have a stated timeline for developing an alternative proposal.

Please keep an eye on the health care legislation being proposed by the Congress. Ostomates all have pre-existing conditions, and the proposed legislation could have a devastating effect on the cost of premiums on many of us, especially those who attempt to buy individual insurance policies. It is my understanding that both of the senators in Texas and all but one of the Republican congressmen from Texas are in favor of some form of legislation that will result in substantial changes in coverage for those with pre-existing conditions. Write to these people and let them know how the new law will affect you. Personal stories should inform their decisions on whether or not to support the new law.

Our next meeting is on June 19. Kris McNeil with Hollister will be our presenter. Hope to see you there.

The meeting was organized by Senator Susan Collins (Maine) and Senator Bill Cassidy (LA). The UOAA office is located in Maine and we have requested a meeting with Sen. Collins.

Our advocacy efforts to ensure access to quality affordable healthcare is protected for all persons living with an ostomy or continent diversion are just beginning. As provisions of a Senate version become available and action is required from our constituents, we will alert you for your ongoing support. There is much work to be done.

Plan Now to Attend the 6th UOAA National Conference!—August 22-26, 2017— Irvine, California


Conference-Related Information

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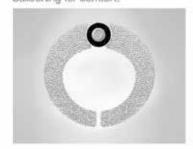
