You know it is hot, really hot, when you step out early in the morning and the temperature is already in the upper eighties. High humidity is pushing the heat index into the triple digits and there is no breeze. You consider stopping to see if the soles of your shoes are melting and leaving prints behind as you walk. Houston has been hot since May and we are just starting into July with more to come. Aside from being dangerous to humans and animals, these conditions can be fatal to ostomy equipment. Consider these tips, stay safe and cool.

- Change your pouching system more often. The adhesives are sensitive to heat and humidity and will degrade much faster based on temperature and activity levels. Do not leave product in your car—it will melt.
- Drink, drink, drink. Ostomates are a lot like cars without radiators, they need constant fluid intake to make their bodies work properly.
- Peristomal skin giving you a new itch? Watch out for monilla. It is characterized as a red itchy rash and is very common during the summer months. Monilla can affect pouch adherence so seek out a WOCN for assistance.
- Water sports are best enjoyed before a big meal and concerned mates can secure their wafer in a frame style with pink tape. Try sealing exterior tape edges with skin protectorant or using a Sure Seal product.
- Outdoor events, cook-offs, craft shows, and garden centers are great to visit except for the dreaded port-a-pottys. Don't be left out, just pack a few extra tissues and wet wipes in your pockets!
- Wear sunglasses and a wide-brimmed hat. Choose loose, lightweight, light-colored clothes and shoes (think cotton).
- If you must do hard labor, work in the coolest times of the day. Replace fluid loss with water at the rate of one liter per hour or more.
- Stay on the lowest floor of your home out of the sunlight. Consider investing in window film. The newer films can reduce incoming temperatures as much as 50% or more.
- Don't rely on fans-they may not stave off heat illness in 90°-plus temperatures.

Baytown group had a great session in June, "New Options for Home Medical Equipment" presented by Linda Crater. Linda is the Department Manager for the new Home/Durable Medical Equipment Division at Walgreens.

Nancy Kibbe, RN, CWON facilitated the meeting as Cindy Barefield was off to National WOCN Conference in New Orleans. Nancy was happy to welcome 12 participants who came to learn what the new service at Walgreens had to offer.

The goal of this new home medical equipment service is to help patients and/or their loved ones manage their health care at home. These items may include:

- Mobility devices such as scooters, walkers with and without wheels, seats and brakes, crutches, adjustable and quad canes, transport and wheel chairs and ramps.
- Medical equipment and supplies such as mastectomy fitting, diabetic shoes and inserts, incontinence supplies, compression hosiery, lift chairs, catheters, bedside commodes, as well as pillows and cushions.
- Wound care such as tape, gauze, sponges, cleansers, and packing strips.
- Bathroom safety items such as grab bars, transfer benches, elevated toilet seats, and bath and shower chairs.
- Braces and supports such as splints, hernia belt, knee stabilizer, short leg walker and abdominal binder.
- Ostomy supplies including 1 and 2-piece systems both drainable and closed, accessories such as seals, deodorant, skin prep, tape and adhesive remover.



Customer Letter



Step One:

Read through this letter to understand the advantage of being a part of the Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation Program.

Step Two:

Take the letter with you to your neighborhood Kroger store the next time you go shopping.

Step Three:

Present the letter with your organization's barcode to your cashier upon checkout. After they have scanned your Kroger*Plus* Card you will be enrolled for the current year of the Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation Program. Every time you shop at Kroger and use your enrolled Kroger*Plus* Card, Kroger will contribute a percentage of your eligible purchases to the Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation fund. Once a card is scanned with the barcode, it will be active for the remainder of the program year.

<u>Q & A</u>

How many Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor accounts can an organization have? One per organization.

Can a household "link" their Kroger*Plus* Card to more than one organization at a time? No, the system allows for one organization per household. To change organizations, you must present your Kroger*Plus* Card and the new organization's barcode to the cashier.

Do I have to enroll each program year?

Yes, all organization's and participants must re-enroll for each program year. <u>Enrollment</u> is June 1, 2011 through Dec 31, 2011 The Neighbor to Neighbor Program <u>accumulation</u> is **July 1**, **2011 through April 30, 2012.**

How much can my organization earn?

The Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation Program will donate \$1 million annually. Each organization will earn a percentage of the \$1 million equal to the percentage of total earned contributions attributable to that organization.

Kroger Cashier: 1. Scan customer's KrogerPlus Card 2. Scan the attached Organization's barcode.

The customer's Kroger *Plus* Card is now enrolled in the Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation Program & contributing funds to their organization. When you scan the barcode, the description on the receipt will say "Loyalty Div 0.00". This means the barcode was properly scanned. The <u>following Friday</u>, the customer's receipt will display a message at the bottom of the receipt saying "Your card is contributing to Neighbor to Neighbor #12345"
