Swimming with an Ostomy

Summer is once again upon us and every year at this time, we are asked if you can still swim or do water sports with an ostomy. The answer is YES! With a little planning ahead, you can continue to enjoy the water as you did before.

Swimming with an ostomy is great cardiovascular activity that is easy on your joints and back. It might be wise to check with your WOC (ET) nurse or doctor first before stepping into the pool but otherwise if you feel well enough for some gentle water work, go for it.

The first thing people worry about, of course, is if their appliance is going to stay on. With proper preparation you can be confident it will. First, you might want to replace the appliance (ideally the night before), whether it's a one or two piece, before you go swimming. Most brands are capable of withstanding the twisting and friction involved in swimming but if you are an especially active "water sporter" you might try Cymed's microskin, or ask your local supplier/WOC nurse what they recommend. Wafers with waterproof tape can be a good choice, or you can tape the edges yourself with waterproof pink tape. (You make a sort of 'picture frame' around the barrier edges).

If your pouch has a filter, tape it shut, to prevent water from getting into the pouch. It won't hurt you if it does, but it can get sloppy—plus, who wants chlorinated or unclean lake water next to the stoma? If you do elect to change brands, it would be wise to wear the new gear for a few changes before you commit to a public splash.

Snug spandex/lycra shorts under board shorts are an excellent choice for men, or snug spandex/lycra bathing suit bottoms for the ladies—these will help hold things in place. You can also use an ostomy belt but cinch it firmly. Ostomy belts aren't going to be

very comfortable when you get out of the water because they'll stay damp a long time. Speaking of damp, Coloplast Mio's new fabric coverings shed water and dry much faster than the usual pouch coverings.



Consider packing an extra bag and flange to change into once you're finished. Knowing that you have that extra gear available will assure peace of mind if you aren't comfortable for some reason.

For those with an ileostomy or busy colostomy, time your meals so that your swim can occur with the least discharge possible. Avoid gas producing foods and drink plenty of water.

Now, having said all this, you know what? Some people don't need to do anything different at all with their routine when they want to get back in the water. Wafers are meant to stay affixed and seal the stoma. Everybody's anatomy and skin is different, so you might have to try a few options before finding the right one for you.

OAHA Editor's note: I have heard once or twice stories of people being denied access to pools because of their ostomies. Two thoughts: 1. Don't tell. 2. Your ostomy is protected under the Disabilities Act and it makes a nice impact to share the knowledge.

Baytown Group News

For the June 1st Baytown meeting, Kris McNeill, Ostomy Sales Specialist from Hollister provided an overview of the latest updates in ostomy supplies and accessories.

Kris shared features of Hollister's Secure Start Program. Secure Start Program not only provides samples; this program provides support for a year if needed.

Ostomy product overview includes the wonderful "floating flange" which is so helpful to those patients in the immediate postop period where the abdomen is tender. Kris explained the color coding system for labels on pouches and wafers. She pointed out that the last number on a pouch matches the last number on a wafer. (GOOD TO KNOW for the new ostomate. This could save you some aggravation and keep you from ordering the wrong thing!)

Additional features of Hollister products include:

- "Lock-n-Roll"is the patented system for securing the pouch and includes an over the top snap for security.
- The filter on the pouch has a protective coating and does not need a sticker.
- Recently redesigned urostomy pouch. Kris noted that the icon is designed to reflect "if it's showing-it's flowing."

- New universal adaptor has been made for all Hollister products. This will accommodate old and new pouches.
- There is also a new one piece flexible pouch.
- In Accessories, there are no-sting options.
- Barrier rings are available in flat and convex options.

We appreciate Kris keeping us up to date with Hollister ostomy products and accessories. In July, Cindy will report on the latest ostomy updates from National WOCN Conference in San Antonio. We hope you will make time to join us on Monday, July 6 at 6pm.

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

Ten Tips for Living Well with an Ostomy

- Learn the basics of your own ostomy care. Practice your skills. Build your confidence. Don't depend on others to do for you what you can do for yourself.
- 2. Anticipate solutions to potential problems. Practice them too. Keep an Emergency Ostomy Supplies Kit in your car in case you have a leak while far away from home.
- Live life. Hold onto your goals. Problem solve as necessary.
 Many limitations on an ostomate's life are self-imposed and not necessary. There are ostomates who are professional athletes, one has sailed around the world on a small boat, and most all still enjoy romantic encounters.
- 4. Have compassion for yourself as you discover and embrace your "new normal." Give yourself a break.
- 5. If you have an intimate partner, communicate honestly with one another—you may both have new feelings and needs.
- 6. Know you are not alone. Use your ostomy support system for seeking and sharing help with special issues; *e.g.*, insurance, intimacy, airport scanners, skin breakdown, scuba diving, paid caregivers, self acceptance.
- 7. Take advantage of professional sources of support for further help with medical, emotional, relational or spiritual issues.
- 8. Acknowledge that having an ostomy has contributed to your life—the positive and the negative. For many of us it has been the difference between life and death.
- 9. Use your experience to help yourself and others.
- 10. Consider becoming a systems advocate for issues important to many living with an ostomy.

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
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
