Harvey and the Ostomy Association of the Houston Area



When Harvey hit landfall near Rockport, we hoped we had dodged another one. However, Harvey made landfall two more times before stalling inland over Houston...for days. The rain just kept coming. Some areas had over 50 inches. My neighbor measured over 25 inches in his rain gauge. We all saw the pictures on TV of people trying to get out of their neighborhoods in boats or walking in chest high water perhaps carrying a pet or a child. The ostomy community was watching too with the horrific thought, what will they do for supplies? My phone is the contact for the Ostomy Association of the Houston Area. While the rain was still falling, I received calls from all over Texas, San Antonio, Fort Worth, South Texas, Victoria, all offering supplies to ostomates caught in the flood.

I also started getting calls from ostomates who had evacuated with few if any supplies. Further, I was contacted by WOC nurses who were trying to get supplies to the shelters but needed an address to ship to. So, since my home was dry, and accessible to both the George Brown Convention Center and NRG Center, my address became ostomy supply central for Houston. Lorette Bauarschi, President of the Houston group, and Patti Suler, our Facebook moderator, and Scott Hiett, our web manager, were in contact and we sent out the request for supplies and the address to ship to

along with my number for those needing supplies. We also sent the message to our email contacts.

One of the first calls I received was from one of our members who had evacuated her two-story house and needed supplies until she

could return. The problem was that one could not get around in Houston. You could not get from one side of town to the other. Areas of town were islands between the bayous and flooded roadways. Moreover, the normal shipping via UPS or FedEX or USPS wasn't running either. Patti happened to have what was needed and was close enough to meet up with the member to give them some supplies. As calls came in, I tried to match up what was requested with what someone had offered in that same area of greater Houston. For one request, Patti picked up the supplies in Spring and drove to meet me on the near northside of Houston and I drove to central Houston to deliver them. One member took supplies to my daughter's house in Katy and, when streets were clear, I picked them up from her.

Meanwhile, in San Antonio, the UOAA group and the local WOC nurses assembled ziplocked individual packages containing a pouch, a wafer, adhesive remover, skin prep, or perhaps a one-piece system of various sizes and configurations of several brands, including pediatric supplies. They drove the supplies from San

Community Room at the Cancer Center was the site for another great turnout with 10 in attendance for this wonderful presentation. Two representatives from Stealth Belt® were on hand to share their experiences not only with the Stealth Belt® product but with their journey as ostomates and support group stories from San Antonio. We enjoyed hosting Christine Miller and Vickie Blume who were visiting Christine's grandmother in our area. It was a fun hour of interaction.

- Band style can have lace added in pink, white or black

Antonio to Houston and delivered them to the medical team at the NRG center. The shelter was only needed for a short time as long-term shelter was found for those affected. I got the call to pick up the supplies from NRG. Apparently, early on supplies were needed at the George Brown Convention Center, the first large shelter, but we were not contacted and were dismissed when we called to offer supplies. This was miscommunication between the medical team and the shelter managers.

About this time, UPS, FedEX, and USPS started delivering again. We received supplies from all over the US and Canada. The ostomate community is amazing and very generous. As requests came in, we did our best to provide something to help each person, hopefully giving them enough to carry over until they had an address for their supplies to ship to or were back at their job so they could pay for supplies or get their insurance. We sent or delivered supplies all over the greater Houston area, to Montgomery, Porter, Beaumont, and points between. Some people I met at a halfway point, some were mailed, some were delivered to hotels, some came to my house to pick them up. We had a member volunteering at the Red Cross Houston

Headquarters and we were able to provide supplies to the medical team there.

And then, there was Irma. Florida was hit by Irma just a week or two after Harvey along with Puerto Rico. I was in contact with Joy Hopper, WOC, in South Georgia so we boxed up the San Antonio supplies left from the NRG shelter and sent them to Joy. She will need to tell this part of the story.

I continued to receive supply requests for several months. The remaining supplies are mostly the odd sizes and less used styles. We are going to ship them to Friends of Ostomates Worldwide. I want to thank the members of the Ostomy Association of the Houston Area, our local WOC nurses, and our local product representatives for all their help and support during this stressful time for Houston. It was heartening to see the outpouring of support we had for each other and gratefulness of the many ostomates we were able to help. The ostomy community around the U.S. and Canada was there for us and I hope we can provide aid to others in the future.

Why Don't We Have a Supply Cabinet?

I've been asked why the Ostomy Association of the Houston Area is not maintaining a supply cabinet all the time. There are several aspects of this effort that have to be addressed. First, we need a location that is centrally located. What is centrally located in Houston? Houston is at least 627 square miles, and with our traffic, not the easiest to navigate. The storage location must be climate controlled as many supplies are temperature sensitive. This organization has a minimal budget without means to pay for space. Second, we need someone to manage the supplies. This involves arranging pickup or delivery of donated supplies, keeping an inventory of what has been donated, being able to help match the available supplies with what is being requested, and then facilitating delivery of the supplies. If the supplies are mailed or shipped, those costs add up. Third, we need the involvement of a WOC nurse to help match supplies to the patient. At one time, Clarice Kennedy, ET, performed this service for our group. Since her death along with the loss of our storage area, we have not been able to accept donated supplies and to share them with those who need them. We did a temporary supply cabinet during Harvey, but it is not sustainable. If anyone has suggestions as to how we could have a supply cabinet, please contact one of the Board members.

Showering with an Ostomy

Dear Nurse Brown,

I really enjoy a long, hot shower. The problem is my pouch gets wet and then takes too long to dry. Is there a way to keep my pouch dry in the shower? —**W.R.**

Dear W.R.,

There are many products on the market to cover your pouch, but with a long, hot shower, even the steam will dampen the pouch. Have you tried drying your pouch and wafer using a hair dryer on a cool setting? You can also fold your empty pouch up



during the shower and secure it with a clip or large bobby pin. This can limit the amount of the pouch that gets wet and then towel dry or use the hair dryer. Some ostomates that use a two-piece system keep a "shower pouch" that they only use during showers, replacing it with the pouch they were going to wear, and allowing the wet pouch to dry until the next shower.




