Clarice E. Kennedy, C.E.T., Honored at this Year's SCR WOCN Conference in San Antonio, Texas

I think to begin with I should tell you who a WOCN is and what they do. Who are they? The South Central Region consists of professionals dedicated to the care and treatment of patients with wound, ostomy, and continence issues and related medical challenges.

The SCR Chapter of the WOCN is comprised of individuals from 5 states (Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma, Texas and Memphis, TN). These WOCN nurses have a conference every year. This year the conference was held in San Antonio, Texas. It was hosted by the officers of the South Central Region and WOCNs who reside in San Antonio.

In order for this event to be financially possible, they invite Vendors to attend and show their products. Vendors work for companies who manufacture ostomy and wound care products. They pay to attend the conference and also sponsor some of the events that occur while at the conference. This gives nurses who attend the opportunity to see new products. Also, WOCN nurses can attend classes given at the conference and earn CEUs (Nursing contact hours). They need these hours for their accreditation and must apply for them after they attend the classes given during the conference. There are special times during the Conference set aside for the Exhibitors to show their products. Each Vendor purchases



Germany by K. Thomas Brie, who is the owner and General Manager of Stomocur FOR LIFE which stands for quality and comfort. His products have been available in Europe for many years and about six years ago he had the opportunity to meet Dr. Marvin Baker, President of High Technology Associates, when he was in Berlin giving a lecture. Dr. Baker found me through a friend who knew about me, and that was the beginning of bringing Stomocur to Houston and my association with Mr. Brie who came to Houston and met with me and Dr. Baker as well as the owner of Spring Branch Medical Supply where I see patients for ostomy care and teaching. The owner of SBMS became the local distributor for Stomocur and we started a Sample Program so that people who wanted to try this new product now available in Houston without having to pay for the samples they wanted.

Now that you have been informed of who WOCN'S are and what they do, and what states comprise the South Central Region, I will give you my history as an Enterostomal Therapist (original name for a person trained in ostomy care). Eventually the name was changed to WOCN. I had to have an Ileostomy in December of 1970 due to severe ulcerative colitis that nearly took my life. The nurses did not know how to instruct me in taking care of my ostomy and we also did not have many products to use in those days. As soon as I was able to a friend took me to a meeting of the local support group for ostomates (known today as the Ostomy Association of the Houston Area). It was through this group of ostomates that I learned how to take care of my ostomy. There were no specialists in ostomy care in Houston at that time. I learned about the profession of Enterostomal Therapy and became very interested in trying to get my training so that I could enter this profession and give the help new ostomates need in order to live life with an ostomy. I talked to my doctors and they thought I would be a good candidate to enter this profession after I was properly trained. I became good friends with another woman in our support group who wanted to enter this field herself. She became the second ET in Houston and worked at the old Hermann Hospital. Her name was Anita Price. She passed away recently. Some of you who read this knew her. With her help and my doctors backing me, I was hired by Hermann Hospital to work with her until I could go to an ET Training program. That plan did not work long since a nurse dropped out of a class Harrisburg Hospital had in teaching Enterostomal Therapy. They accepted my application and I went to Harrisburg's program and graduated and passed all of the tests. I also had to write a Master Case Study on one of my patients which was a requirement then to become certified. I had six months in which to do that. My Master Case Study was accepted by the director of Harrisburg's Enterostomal Therapy program and I became certified. Having a Bachelor's degree in nursing was not a requirement at that time.

I have spent over 35 years of my life in this profession. I am totally dedicated to my profession and feel blessed even though I am getting older that I can still do what I have been doing for so

many years and that is helping others who because of some disease or accident learn to live life with an ostomy.

I am also grateful to Thomas Brie for his dedication to making the best ostomy and wound care products that he can and continues to improve when needed to make life better for those who have to live it with an ostomy. He sponsored the Cocktail Reception and was recognized by the officers of the SCR WOCN for making the Cocktail Reception possible.


